Boarding reps are the voice of their peers and meet with me at least once every halfterm and we are joined by Mr Ferrari and Mrs Francis for every

other meeting. During these meetings, reps convey suggestions from their year group. Minutes are taken and feedback is given quickly. Where possible, sensible suggestions are acted upon and if not, the rationale for why something cannot happen, or change is given.

As numbers are smaller, I meet with Parc House boarders as a group every two weeks and again this is an opportunity to make suggestions and requests.

There are suggestion boxes in both houses for students to post ideas and suggestions anonymously.

Work experience A few of our boarders have taken advantage of school connections to get some worthwhile work experience. Samhat spent a productive week at the Milford Haven LNG terminal during the October half-term break last year using a parent contact facilitated by Mr Ferrari.
