Arrival and departure

It is a challenge as we approach each holiday to collect this information in a timely manner and I greatly appreciate those parents who send me flight confirmation emails as soon as flights are booked. These details are shared with all boarders so that they can try and coordinate travel plans to save on airport transport costs.


These appointments were timed to ensure that the majority of our parents would be able to 'attend' and I hope that you found the feedback useful.

NHS/medication/illness

Just a gentle reminder that we have a supply of over the counter (OTC) medicine treat common to complaints in both boarding houses - headaches, sore throats, period pain etc. There is no need to send any medication over with your child unless it is prescription medication, in which case I must be informed by the medication email and name/instructions must be translated into English by а doctor/pharmacist.

Any medication found in pupil rooms that has not been declared is a major breach of the school rules and will lead to disciplinary action up to and including being asked to leave boarding.

Please remember also that the healthcare system in the UK is probably very different to what you experience in your country. In most cases in which an illness is not showing signs of improvement after a few days, we would first consult the local pharmacist who are able to administer some medications. They may advise to make an appointment with the local doctor. We are fortunate to be very close to the local hospital and this would be our first port-of-call for any serious medical issue.

We are fortunate at St. Mike's to have a resilient group of boarders who will generally only ask to stay in their rooms if they are feeling really unwell as they understand the importance of being in lessons. I meet regularly with nurses from within our group of schools and can seek their advice. One of their best pieces of advice is that 'it's ok and normal to feel unwell occasionally' and 'that triggers for why someone may experience headaches for example should be explored before administering medication screentime, sleep patterns etc.'

I would like to thank the vast majority of our boarders who keep themselves in good physical and mental health by good basic hygiene, a good diet, plenty of sleep and exercise.



Another reminder that we collect in the electronic devices from Parc House boarders on school nights (Sunday – Thursday) to ensure that they get a good night's sleep. Older boarders are permitted to keep them overnight at the weekend.

Again, I would like to recommend that parents, particularly those of our younger boarders have made use of Screentime (iOS) or Family Link (Android) to monitor and control phone/app use during the evenings and weekends.

Like all schools, our WiFi network is filtered and monitored but we have no control over what your child can access over 4/5G networks provided by their phone providers.

Below is how Parc House store their devices each evening and staff will randomly check that phones are genuine and have a working SIM card installed. Although a rare occurrence, it is always disappointing when we discover a second phone, tablet or laptop and it leads to a loss of privileges for the rest of that term.


